

#### **Hard times in the Desert**



Life has been always hard in the tiny villages we serve in the Chihuahuan desert. Lack of electricity, poor roads and poor communication services make it very difficult for the people living here to eke out a living. The climate in this region is very harsh. Obviously the desert is very dry. In addition the temperatures in this region are very extreme. Daytime temperatures of over 110 degrees Fahrenheit in summertime are the norm. While in the winter it is not unusual to see temperatures in the teens. In spite of the lack of infrastructure, harsh conditions and with little support from the Mexican government (or should I say in spite of the Mexican government) the people have managed to survive.

In our recent trips to the region we discovered that the people are suffering greatly. For several reasons they are unable to sell the candelilla wax. In Jaboncillos they are only selling very small amounts of the flagstone. Everyone says the same thing; "We have never seen times so hard". We encountered one family who was telling us of their situation during which the father commented; "If only I had 10 pesos to buy some food". We had some extras we were able to share with them and a few

#### **BRING HOPE and save \$**

We have shared with you many times that the people tell us, "Please do not stop coming. You give us hope." We want to encourage you to consider coming with us. I know that many of you are worried about the violence you hear about in the news. It is true that in certain areas of Mexico it is quite dangerous. We have been in Mexico 6 times this year. (Three of those have been with groups) At no time did we encounter any violence. We did encounter more police presence throughout the region which indicates that the government is working hard to suppress any incursion of violence into this region.

We also recognize that finances are difficult. We are always trying to find ways to lower costs. We wish we could lower the fees but we must cover the cost of each trip. One of things that will help with the finances of each trip is to have adequate staffing for each trip. To that end we are making an offer to all who have been with us in the past. For each person you recruit (first time participation, paid in full) we will discount your next trip \$75. If you recruit as many as four we will scholarship your entire fee. We hope that this will help us improve our staffing efforts and help you with finances.

#### **Domingo and Chavela**

I don't know about you, but often times when I hear about earthquakes and floods happening in other parts of the world, I feel numb. I hear and see on the television about the violence across the border and though I cross the border at least a dozen times each year, what's happening in Juarez or Laredo still leaves me feeling pretty much "untouched". I've been crossing at Eagle Pass and Presidio over the last twenty-four years and I've never seen any killings and I've never been threatened by any situation.

This past spring we began to hear from the villagers about the "hard times" (tiempos duros) that they are experiencing. Their means of making a living has been essentially taken away from them. Most villagers in the Chihuahuan desert harvest, boil, and extract wax from the candelilla plant. They have been selling this hard wax to buyers for at least a century. At this time there are no "buyers". No buyers, no money.

It was not until I sat down and spoke with

Domingo & Chavela (Ten Pesos)

It was their voices and their eyes that got to me. Domingo, a small, wiry man with graying curly hair and mustache said to me:" We have been selling our burros to buy food to put on the table." His voice sounded frustrated and fearful. His eyes appeared angry. The families need the burros to haul the candelilla to the burning pits. "If I had ten pesos (approximately \$1) I would go to the conasupe (local supply store), but I don't even have that."

Chavela, a bronzed skin woman in her fifties was also frowning as she contemplated their situation." We have another grown son and a second son who is not mentally well living with us. We just don't know what we're going to do."

I "felt" their fear and their frustration. I felt helpless. Curtis and I had 5 pounds of flour, one pound of beans and rice with us. I went to the room in which we were staying. I picked up the supplies; brought them back to the church and gave them to Domingo and Chavela. Then we knelt down and prayed.

#### Renewal

All of us from time to time need the time to reassess where we are in our lives. This is especially true in our walk with the Lord. Most of us are very busy with human activity and seldom take time to address the need to renew our spirits. I know this is true of me and I have learned that I need to take time away from all of the activity to allow Him to touch my spiritual and emotional needs. During our many trips with various groups we try very hard to help individuals with these same needs. In fact this was our original concept of *changing lives on both sides of border*.
