22 But be doers of the word, not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

I often question how any of us can sit comfortably and do little or nothing while the world is rampant with injustice, disease and poverty! Read Mathew Chapter 25 verses 31 through 46. This is where the Lord says he will separate the sheep from the goats. As you read this ask yourself, "In which herd do I belong?" Then read the preceding parable of the talents (verses 14-30). This parable indicates that our whole life should be about the business of the King.

I am not saying that there is no one within the church who is busy doing Kingdom work. There are many individuals who sacrifice both time and money to expand and improve the Kingdom. My concern is that there are too few of us involved in the work.

liked to run drugs through, but today's modern technology makes people moving through these areas more noticeable. Therefore the highly populated areas become the areas they like to pass through by blending in to the local population on both sides of the border.

None of this is to say that the area has no problems. The Zetas basically control most of this region and do use it to cache weapons and/or drugs. Recently the Mexican army has been raiding these caches. There was some worry that these raids would become violent, but so far there have been no violent clashes. These raids have taken place south of the area we serve. The villagers, however, have told us that there has been an increased presence of soldiers in the region and this makes them feel safer as well. By all accounts the military is known to not to be a corrupt organization in Mexico and therefore the people of Mexico appreciate their presence.

All in all we still feel confident that we can continue with our work. We will continue to monitor the situation and if necessary we will not hesitate to cancel trips just as we did last fall. Unfortunately that cancellation was based on a false report.

Please continue to pray for us and the groups we take. Pray for the whole of Mexico. This situation is very difficult for the government of Mexico.

In your prayers you might consider going with us on one of the medical trips. I know that fear can be a very powerful emotion. But in my prayers if I look at the situation with a rational mind I can overcome my fears and let my Lord lead me to do things that I might not otherwise do. Seek the Lord and He will guide you. While we do not throw caution to the wind we have to make decisions based on His instructions.
